Request for a special meeting of the Irvine City Council regarding the

All American Asphalt plant operations

The All American Asphalt plant operations continue to generate widespread complaints and growing public health concerns from residents in the northern part of Irvine.

On July 28, 2021, I held a Community Meeting at City Hall to hear from those Irvine residents impacted by the All American Asphalt plant. Many of the young adults and parents who attended the Community Meeting expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to be heard and recognized. However, many of these same residents echoed my belief that this important matter should be heard and addressed at an official meeting of the Irvine City Council.

In January and again in May, I requested that this matter be placed on a City Council agenda. To date, my Council colleagues have not been willing to "second" my request. Under the City Council's prevailing "Rule-of-Two," a second Councilmember (or the Mayor) must sign-on to a request before an item can be placed on the agenda.

Mayor Khan, given the importance of this issue, I ask you to exercise your authority to call a Special Meeting of the Irvine City Council — to be scheduled in the second half of August or in the first week of September — devoted exclusively to the above-referenced matter for a comprehensive discussion that includes ample opportunity for public participation and presentations.
